Scott then invited everyone on the call to introduce themselves. Scott reviewed the agenda for the meeting.

September 2020 and end August 2021, as originally planned. All 2020 SMDP Biotech scholars will attend the BIO International Convention (BIO) in Boston, Monday, June 14 through Wednesday, June 16, 2021. Mentors have the option of attending BIO and ICPD will provide each mentor with full convention access. Mentors will be responsible for travel and lodging costs. There will be a scholar/mentor debrief session and site visit the morning of Monday, June 14. If mentors are not at this session in-person, then they should plan to join virtually.

Scott advised the committee that ICPD made the determination that the 2020 SMDP Biotech training will be virtual. We wanted to make sure that as we make this change, students still get to participate in the BIO International convention. All scholars of the 2020 SMDP Biotech cohort will get to attend the 2021 BIO International Convention in Boston (BIO). Mentors who would like to attend BIO can do so at no cost as ICPD guests.

 Program agenda and speaker needs - review of revised agenda (posted on the committee page); recommend speakers to Elisabeth Valerio (evalrio@icpdprograms.org) by August 15; special activities for the 20th anniversary of SMDP

Elisabeth directed the committee members to the committee page where they could locate the draft of the training session agenda. It is being reformatted from a 3-day in person training to a 2-day virtual training. Virtual training will begin at 7:30 am PT on Sunday, September 20th. Esteban Santos Executive VP of Operations at Amgen will be the welcoming keynote speaker. Charlene Rincon, Director Plant Manager, Amgen, will serve as Master of Ceremony. Scholar and mentor introductions will occur during two separate sessions to make sure we cover everyone. We will have a very brief lunch break in between the 2 introduction sessions. We will then transition into sessions typical of the in-person SMDP training. Elisabeth thanked everyone that has come forward and recommended speakers. She encouraged others to continue sending speaker recommendations so there is representation from all sponsor companies. The day will end at 2:45 pm PT. Monday's session will begin again at 7:30 am PT. The second day will end at 2:30 pm PT. There will be virtual break-out sessions for the one-on-one mentor/mentee meetings.

Richard Besingi asked if some of the scholars will be onsite or if the training will be completely virtual. Scott adviced that the training will completely virtual due to COVID safety concerns. Elisabeth added that we welcome any additional thoughts or ideas to ensure that this a great experience for the participants. Eileen Elliott asked how many scholars we will have. Scott answered about 55 scholars will be selected this year.

Scott noted that we are close to firming up the new cohort. We have a wide variety of students from universities accross the country and Puerto Rico. Scott thanked Dustie and her team for their outstanding outreach efforts. Scott also thanked the selection committee for reviewing all of the applicants and their supporting materials.
