Scott May welcomed the committee members to Scientist Mentoring and Diversity Program for Medical Technology (SMDP MedTech) Outreach & Planning Committee call. Scott mentioned the agenda was sent via email. Scott reminded the committee members they could locate the agenda, past meeting notes and supporting documents for the meeting on the website <u>www.icpdprograms.org</u>, select "Committees" from the "Select an ICPD site" drop-down menu at the top right side of the page. Scott then invited everyone on the call to introduce themselves. Scott reviewed the agenda for the meeting.

Planning the 2020 SMDP MedTech, October 3-7 in Toronto Canada

companies support outreach to students, including providing contact information and

introductions? ICPD has set a cap of 40 scholar/mentor pairs for each program, but if sponsorship demand exceeds that then staff will present to the committee a proposed program structure that will allow for concurrent training at the same location

Scott explained that we are busy working on the preparations for the launch of the 2020 SMDP MedTech program. This will be our first non-US based training session. SMDP MedTech will be held in Toronto Canada from October 3-7. Scholar recruitment has been happening over the last few months and will go until the deadline of April 3. Outreach is being led by Dustie Savage and her team of scholar alumni. Their efforts include, emails, social media, phone calls and meetings through our alumni network, university contacts and societies.

Elisabeth then spoke about the visa verification policy. Two years ago, a change was made to the objective criteria for the applicants to require they can legally work in the United States indefinitely, without needing a visa or sponsorship. Generally, when the students are in the United States on student visas, they are only permitted to work in the United States for one year upon graduation. They would not be eligible for an SMDP fellowship. Elisabeth asked the committee for their thoughts. Scott added that all applicants are asked if they require a visa and if they can permanently work in the United States. Scott asked the committee to email himself or Elisabeth if their companies would be open to admitting Canadian students.

Scott informed the committee that May 8th is the deadline for anyone interested in being a part of the selection committee. The selection committee will review all applicants and their supporting documents. They can email Elisabeth Valerio to let her know they are interested.

We have cancelled the pilot program of giving students extra credit based on how early they apply to SMDP.

Scott noted that the committee was emailed a list of all universities that have had students apply for SMDP over the last 5 years. Scott explained that the list of universities does not contain all of the universities on ICPD's contact list. The committee was also emailed a list of the professional societies ICPD partners with or wants to partner with for outreach to students. The amount outreach to professional societies has increased over the last two years. ICPD connects with the societies primarily via emails and phone calls, but ICPD is seeking to have representatives at the annual meetings of the societies. This can be ICPD staff, alumni or staff from sponsor companies.

Scott mentioned several discussion items on the agenda – Should ICPD permit Canadian students to receive fellowships to attend SMDP?; How can ICPD recruit more Native American and Pacific Islander students?; and, how can the sponsor companies support SMDP outreach to universities and professional societies? Elisabeth added that we would like to cross connect with sponsor companies on social media such as Twitter. No suggestions were offered by the committee; Scott directed the committee to the Call for Applicants page and requested they share it with their contacts at universities and professional society meetings.

Orlando Guillory asked if he could see the resumes of the Scholars on the portal. Elisabeth explained that all the scholars are asked to have their current resumes posted on the portal, especially if they are job seeking. She explained to Orlando how he can do specific searches



on the portal and post jobs. Dustie offered her assistance to Orlando on posting job and internship opportunities.

Mentors – notify Scott May of mentor selection by August 14

- The deadline to notify Scott of mentors for the SMDP MedTech program is August 14th.

Elisabeth is starting to work on speakers for the 2020 SMDP MedTech program. The speaker needs are on the committee page. Elisabeth encouraged the committee members to not hesitate or wait to submit any names for speakers. It is never too early.

- Elisabeth shared that there is a new feature on the SMDP portal called "Monday Mentoring Moments". Every month there will be a theme that will be featured on the portal. This will help guide the virtual mentoring by providing the scholar/mentor pairs with topics for discussion that are specific to the mentoring plans. The modules are in the top left-hand side of the SMDP Mentoring Portal. All portal members (not just the current scholars and mentor) have access to these and members can subscribe to the mentoring moments. The "Mentoring Moments" will also be shared externally so people who are not a part of SMDP can learn from the Mentoring Moments. This is a good service for applicants who are not admitted to or who do not qualify for SMDP but can gain benefit from the content in the modules.
